Mrs. Petrosky welcomed the residents to the meeting, and introduced the individuals representing the Authority. Approximately 40 residents attended, including Commissioner Haigis.

Mrs. Petrosky explained the need for the line replacement in both areas – Country Hills and portions of St. Clair, Ward, Wayne, Torie, Pettigrew, Richard and Colonial Manor Road. Mrs. Petrosky also discussed the need for a small number of easements and the process for obtaining signatures. In addition, the lateral inspection program was reviewed.

System Superintendent Chuck Gilbert narrated a video showing a televised inspection of a main line in Country Hills that highlighted a number of the problems that have been discovered.

Engineer Dave Coldren had a PowerPoint presentation on the history of the Authority, scope of the projects, lateral inspections and repairs and grant status.

Authority Solicitor Donald J. Snyder answered questions on the easements and the need to condemn if necessary.

Residents questions related to a variety of topics –

- Possibility of lining laterals and spot repairs
- Location and purpose of easements
- Condemnation
- Cost of lateral repairs
- Storage site on Laurel Avenue in first project (site is owned by Fred Crack, who permitted our contractor to use it for storage)
- Dumping trash on Laurel Avenue site
- Fencing that needs to be removed during the project and then be replaced
- Piles of stone and dirt stored on roads
- Driveway repairs

The residents also had an opportunity to meet with Dave Coldren and/or Chuck Gilbert and review the drawings as they pertained to their individual properties. The Authority will follow-up with the residents who had questions on their easements, make adjustments if possible, and then send out formal requests for easements during early January.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 8:45 PM.
